April 2-4, 27 eighth graders, Miss Bekermeier, Mrs. Zientek, Mrs. Deeter, and 10 parents headed to Kentucky to visit and explore the Creation Museum and Ark Encounter. This trip built upon what these students have learned about creation and the flood in Bible and science class.

The students had an impactful and fun-filled trip to the Creation Museum and Ark Encounter. We were so thankful for safety (even in storms that came), learning what happened, and memories that were created. The students were impressed by the detail in the museums and all of the



information both had to offer. The class loved exploring different exhibits and insightful experiences throughout such as the seven Cs in God's eternal plan (Creation, Corruption, Catastrophe, Confusion, Christ, Cross, Consummation); a 4D movie on Noah's life; an exhibit focused on precious babies and abortion called "Fearfully and Wonderfully Made;" and an in-depth display at the ark of what it looked like and what was inside of it.

On top of all the learning, everyone shared in laughter and created many memories from walking through the petting zoo, the lunch and dinner stops, time at the hotel pool, conversations on the road trip, and goofy moments that happened. 


- Lots of March Daily Needs


