K-4 CHRISTMAS PROGRAM TOMORROV

Trinity Christian School K-4 grade students hold their Christmas programs tomorrow.

Kindergarten and 1st grade will perform Jesus Means Christmas to Me at 6:00 p.m. Students need to be in their classrooms by 5:30 p.m.

Front doors will open at 5:15 p.m. Parents will be directed to follow signs around to the north hallway to line up for entrance into the cafetorium. Cafetorium doors will open at 5:30 p.m. once things are ready to go.

2nd, 3rd, and 4th graders will perform Emmanuel at 9:30 a.m. and 7:00 p.m. Students need to be in their classrooms by 6:30 p.m. for the evening performance.

When arriving for the second program, kindergarten and 1st grade will be on stage preforming so please be respectful of this. Please follow signs leading to the north hallway where you will form a line as you wait for the first program to finish up. Doors will open around 6:45 p.m. and you will then be able to find your seats.

Once your child's program concludes, you will be directed to pick **them up** from their **classroom**.

All students, except for 4th graders, should wear their "Christmas **Best**" for the evening performance. We tell the kids that this means nice clothes that would be worn to church on Christmas or for family pictures (no jeans or sweats allowed).

Fourth grade families should check the email from Mrs. Tanka, sent out in November, to find out what your child needs to wear.

Trinity Christian School's Robotics Teams had the opportunity to learn from three distinguished guests about the topic of energy, throughout the 2022 season.

To start things off, the President of The Society of Women Engineers (SWE) and General Electric Engineer, Ms. Dayna **Johnson**, talked to the students about energy, Oct. 25 and 26. Ms. Johnson spoke about leading teams of engineers

and how SWE advances the field of engineering. TCS Robotics members learned about the latest advances in solar and wind power in both onshore and offshore production. The presentation emphasized the measures engineers take to bring electric power to people, and the challenges that engineers are working to overcome. Ms. Johnson followed her presentation with a questionand-answer session. The Society of Women Engineers has more than 40,000 individual members comprised of both college students and professionals.

The team's second guest was Mr. Brian Madderom, Senior Engineering Manager for Constellation Energy. He spoke to the robotics teams about how nuclear energy works and is harnessed to generate electricity. Students learned about nuclear fuel, including that the fuel pellets are the size of mini marshmallows, and cost about \$100 million dollars per nuclear reactor. Mr. Maddersom went on to explain that the fuel in each nuclear reactor powers a million homes for six years without needing new fuel.

Finally, Ms. **Diane Rink**, the Director of Regional Field Operations at Nicor Gas, addressed the teams via Zoom about natural gas, Nov. 29 and 30. She taught students where natural gas comes from and how it is used (powering homes); along with information about renewable natural gas (RNG). Ms. Rink explained that natural gas is used to make steel, glass, and raw materials. She also described the variety of ways to process natural gas (RNG, liquified natural gas



[LNG] and compressed natural gas [CNG]), and how engineers at Nicor explore and perfect new ways of utilizing this resource.

To conclude the 2022 season, 62 students from the TCS Robotics Teams will compete in the Illinois State FLL Robotics Qualifying Championship Competition this month. Last year they were awarded the Rising Star Award, which is given to teams that have captured the attention of the judges as having excellent future potential.

TCS's Robotics Team is sponsored by <u>Caterpillar</u>, and led by head coaches Mrs. Christine McBride and Ms. Terese Osacky, along with a team of parent volunteer coaches. The TCS Robotics Teams participate in First Lego League Robotics Program. Each year First Lego League challenges students with a specific theme, which was energy this year. During the season, robotics students researched energy, chose a problem to identify, and innovated solutions for that problem focused within the theme of energy. Bringing in industry leaders helped students gain valuable real-world insight to use in their innovation project for competition.
