We have watched our student population change from 50 kids in 1993 to over 400 kids in preschool through eighth grade in 2022. Trinity Christian School has always strived to keep Christ the center of all that takes place here.

Students have several opportunities throughout the year such as, Operation Christmas Child. raking leaves in the neighborhood, spending time at the local nursing homes, and much more.



Spiritual Retreats and Trips are done with our junior high to challenge our students by digging deeper into the word and growing them closer together as a class in the Lord. Guest speakers, team building, and great fellowship occur to encourage these kids in their biblical worldview. A new experience that has been added this past year was a trip to the Creation Museum and The Ark, where students can experience firsthand wisdom in their biblical worldview. SERVANTS AND LEADERS

At Trinity Christian School, we teach our students to be servants and leaders. Our older students are paired up with younger students throughout the year, leading them in prayer, reading with them and helping them with school work.

Our student body engages in community outreach through programs such as Feed My Starving Children and Operation Christmas Child. We also minister to the residents of the nursing home down the block by writing them Christmas cards and valentines, playing board games with them and sharing our testimonies with them.





In 30 years of academic excellence at Trinity Christian School, some things have not changed: our mission, our standard and our pursuit of excellence.

Our Mission

The mission our founding families had when they opened the school in 1993 is still the same mission today. Trinity Christian School provides a goal-directed approach to education and equips children with the desire, discipline, and skills to pursue excellence in all that they do "with all their heart, as working for the Lord." (Colossians 3:23)

Our Standard

The vision of Trinity Christian School is to make a difference for Christ in the lives of its students, its families, and the communities in which we are situated by providing a balanced education based on biblical principles. Our academics include programs that are designed to develop a person wholly: mentally, physically, socially and spiritually. Outside of the classroom, Trinity students model leadership through participation in chapel, sports and activities and community service.

Dedicated to Christian education, Trinity's teachers are state certified, complete weekly professional development, attend outside conferences as well as use training resources provided by ACSI (Association for Christian Schools International) to keep current in the best practices to improve student learning.

Education continues to evolve, and over the years, the needs of our students have changed as well. Trinity provides for these varying needs through a number of means. Along with assistance from our Learning Resource Coordinator, students receive opportunities for additional instructional support from our teachers through our WIN (What I Need) program which was added this year. All students benefit from this 20-30 minute focus period that provides

students with supported study hall, teacher-led small groups, and facilitated technology supported learning. Teachers have reported that this time has been beneficial to improving students' skill, confidence, and scores. To ensure that students demonstrate progress towards mastery of state standards, we've updated our assessment tools to include monitoring standardized progress and а achievement test from IOWA. Trinity graduates go on to be Christian leaders and excel in academics in high school.

Trinity has made great advancements in technology instruction over the last few years. Blessed with the donation of 300 iPads and subsequently the purchase of laptops for fifth through eighth grade this year, students in grades kindergarten through eighth are 1:1, using technology to support and demonstrate their learning. The digital literacy, problem solving, engineering, coding and programming skills that they are mastering in their computer classes will prepare them for future success in high school and beyond.



Our Pursuit of Excellence

Trinity Christian staff and faculty are purposeful about our ministry and doing all that we do to the glory of God. We recognize the profound impact that our model and witness have on the lives of our students and families. It is for this reason that the board and administration have committed to the process of ACSI accreditation.


In our pursuit of continued school improvement, we have begun the process of obtaining accreditation through the Association of Christian Schools International. We have been members of this Christian organization for over 15 years. ACSI provides training and resources to Christian schools and educators. Their goal is to develop and strengthen the leadership of Christian schools so that they can thrive. TCS is a state-recognized school. This means that our school has been reviewed and proven to have met or exceeded Illinois school requirements. The distinction of further accreditation is not required, but one that we've chosen to pursue to edify our school, validate our program as excellent compared to Christian schools nationwide, and to fulfill our school mission and vision. The accreditation process, which may take two to three years, will strengthen our school in three domains: our purpose, our relationships, and teaching and learning.

The accreditation protocol will evaluate us in the areas of mission, spiritual formation and biblical worldview development, governance and school leadership, positive school culture, stakeholder and community engagement, instructional program, and curriculum planning.

Thank you to Mrs. Toya Thomas, our Special Events and Volunteer Coordinator, and to all the volunteers who made these events possible!









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
"I'M A BLESSED MAN."


